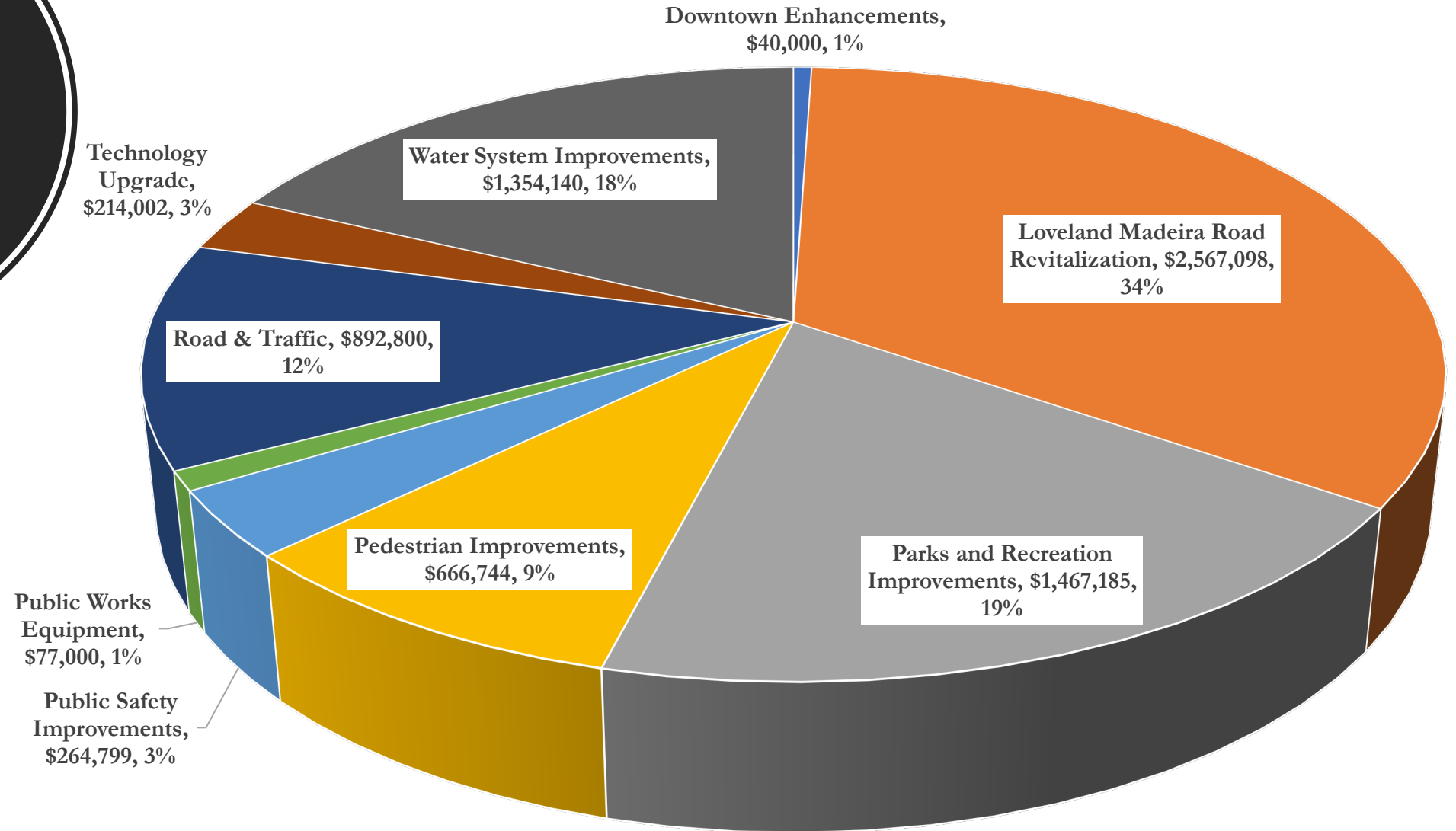

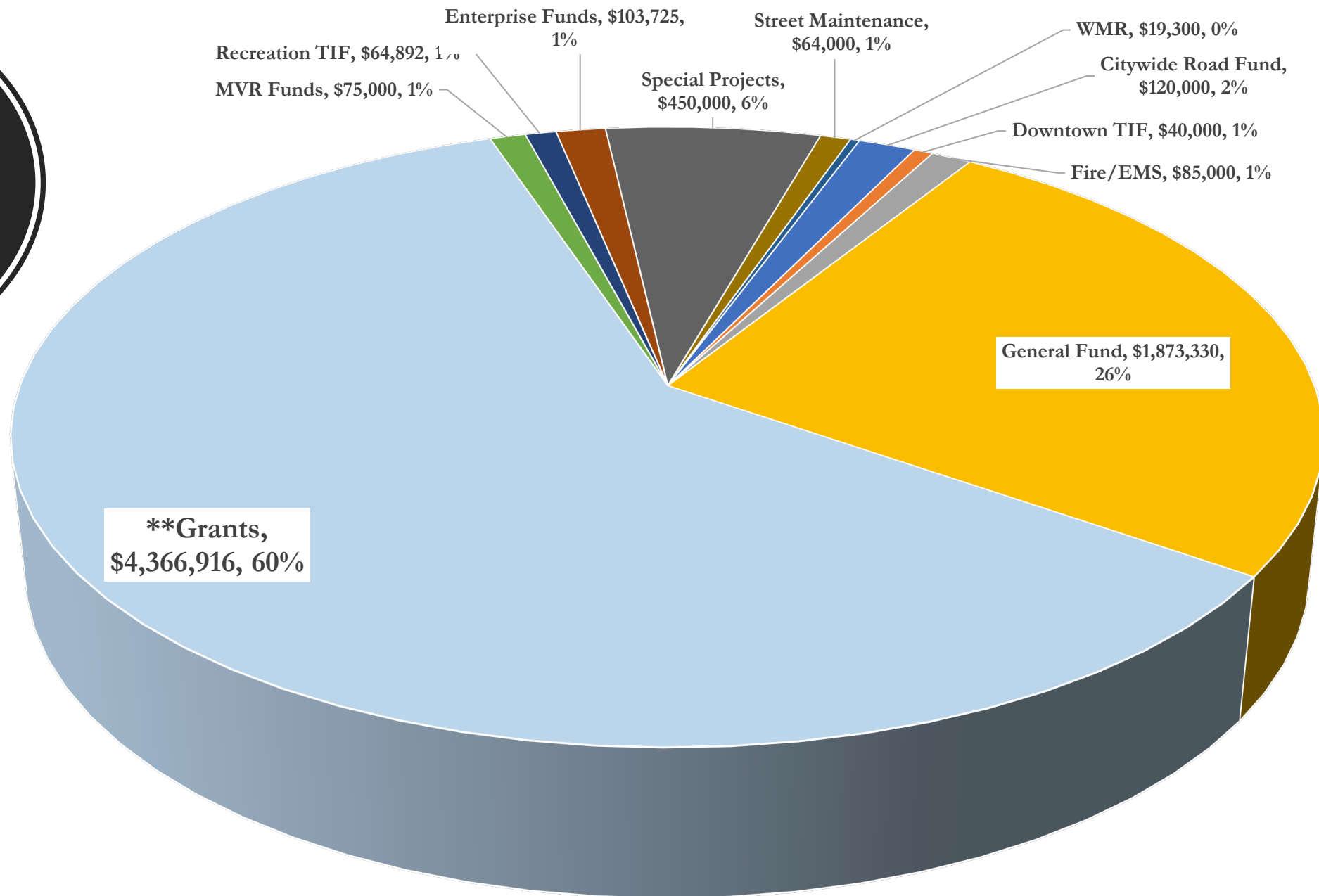
- CIP Project Selection Process

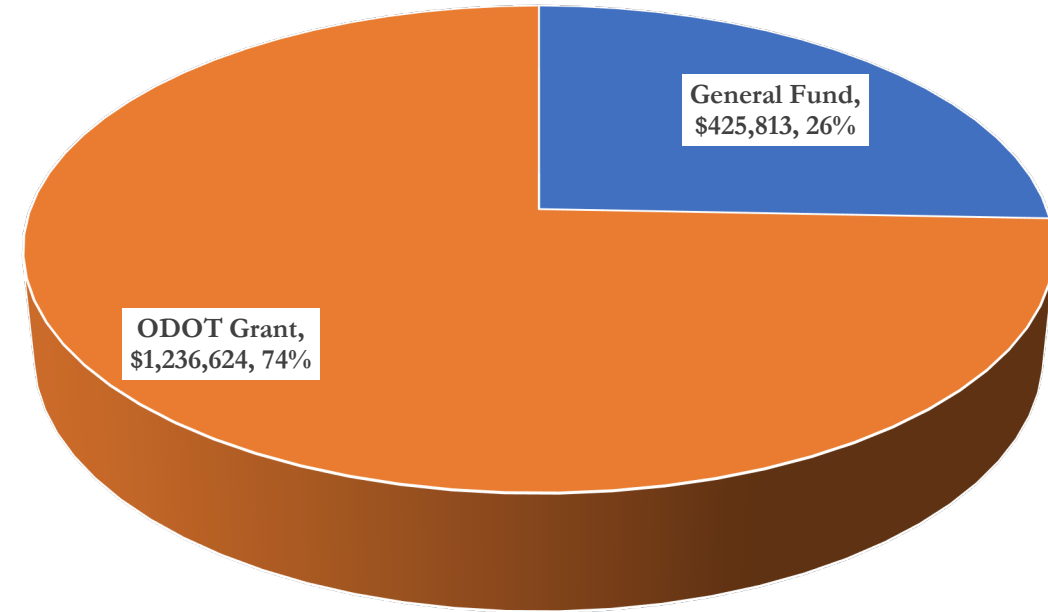

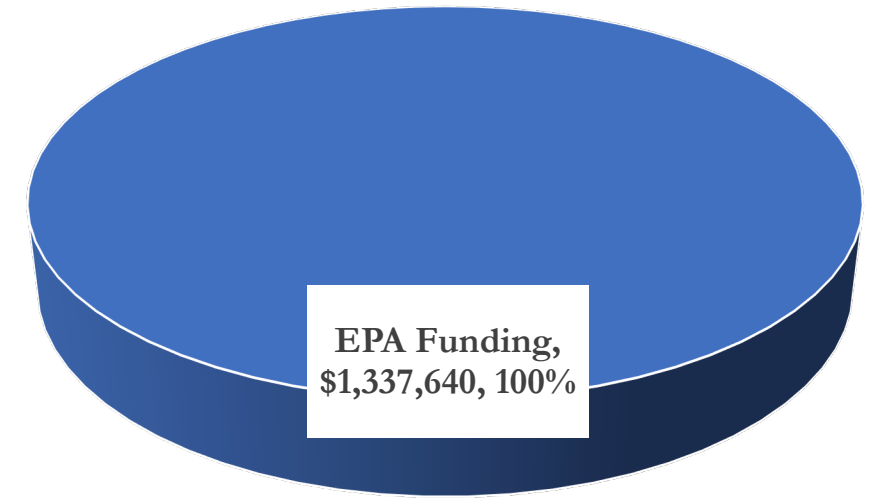
Project Components and Highlights

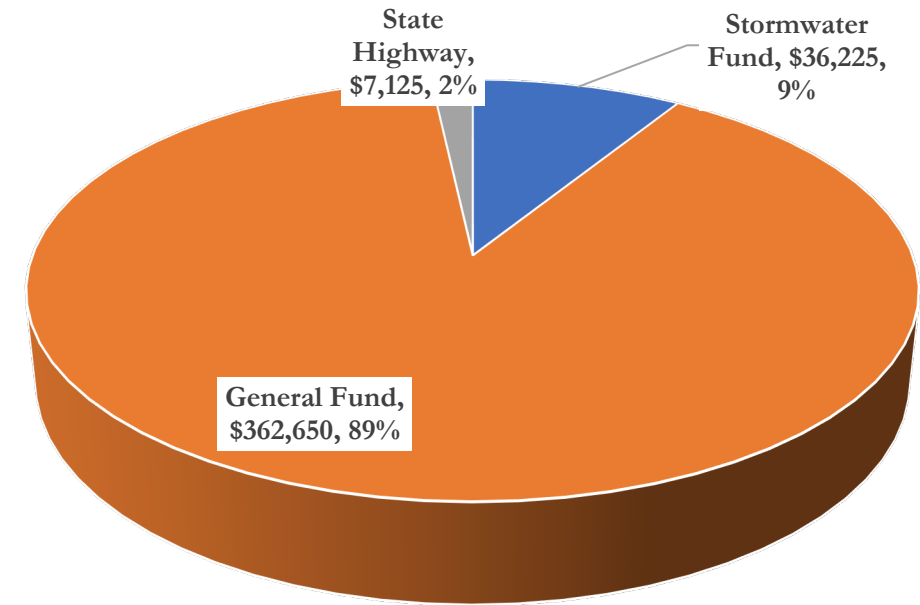
Project Components and Highlights

- ✓ Design of 4 MGD PFAS Treatment Facility
- ✓ Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) Vessels Selected via Rapid Small Scale Testing (RSSCT)
- ✓ New Treatment building with office, control room, lab, electrical room, and chemical feed rooms
- ✓ Design will account for future softening opportunities
- ✓ New clearwell for chlorine contact time

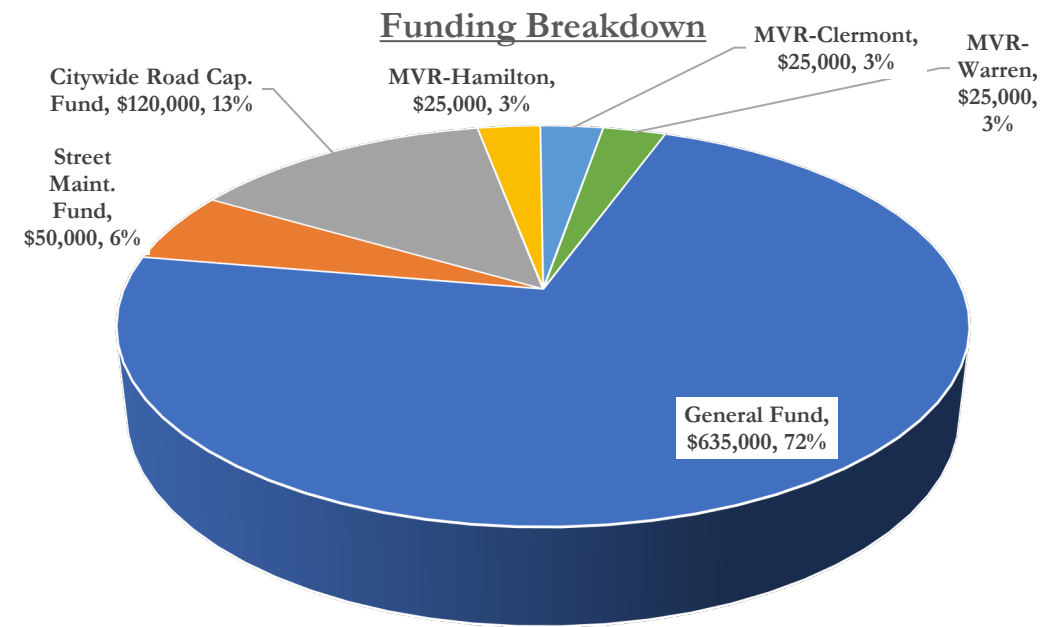

- ✓ Phase 2 will be extended to connect to a Future Clermont County Park Trail Head

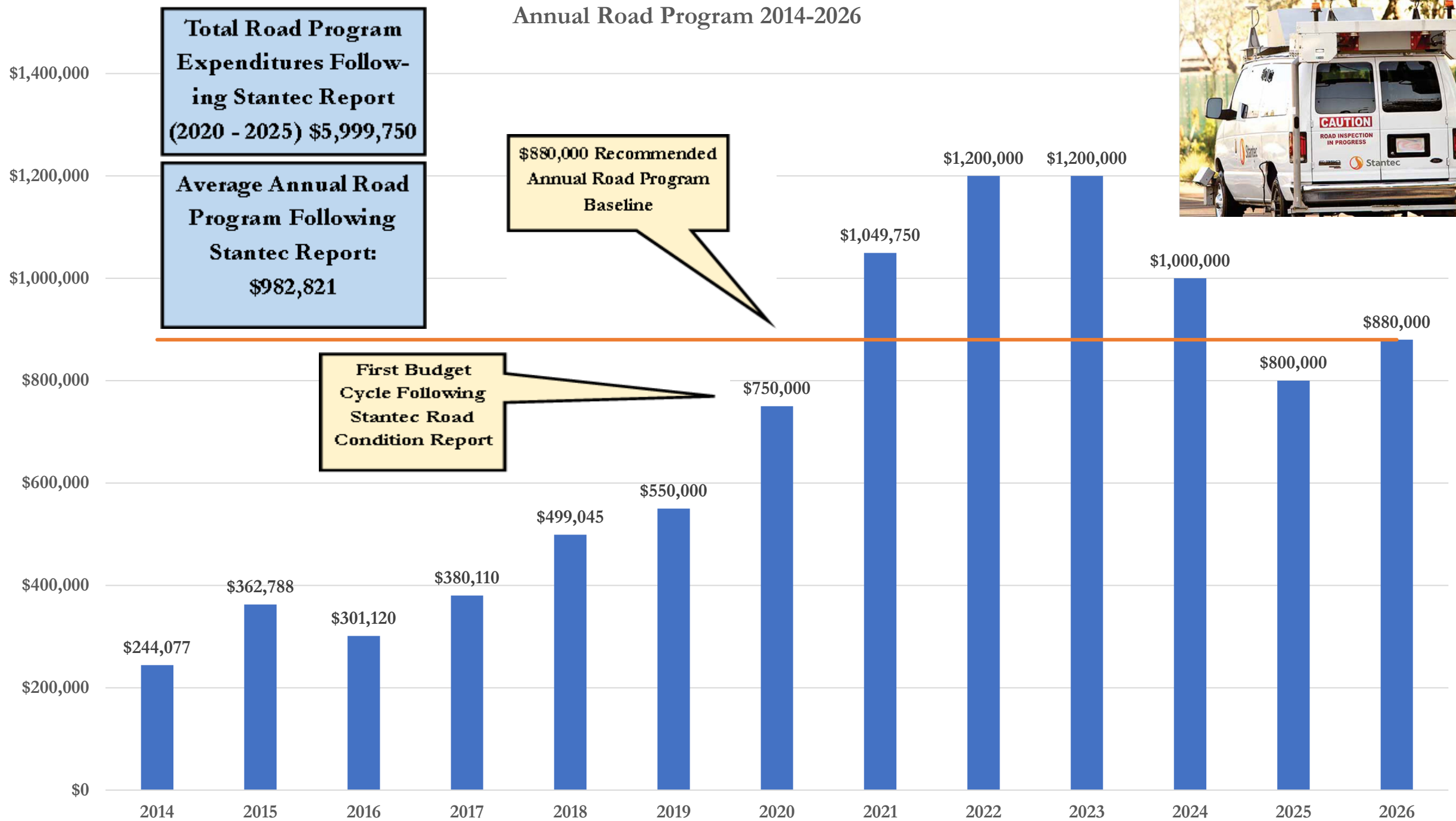

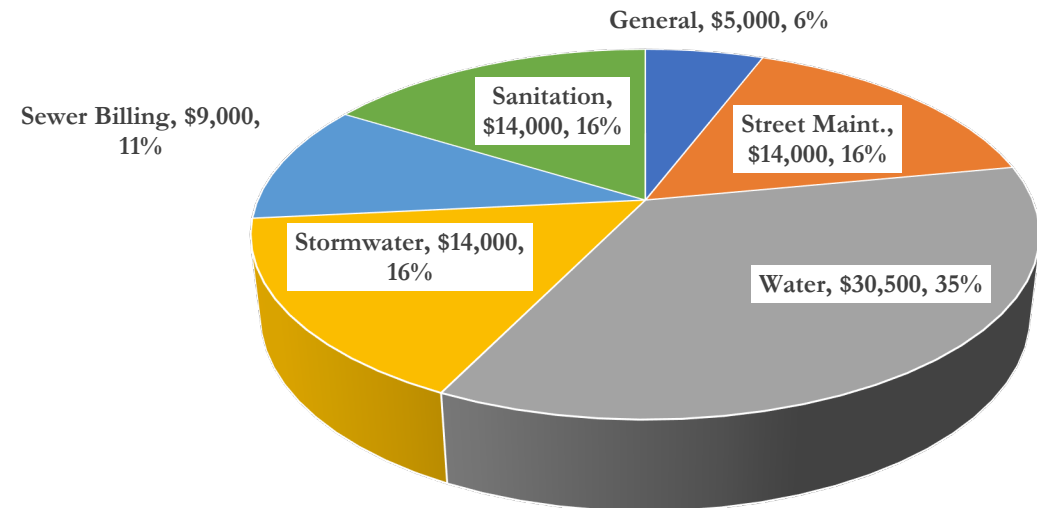

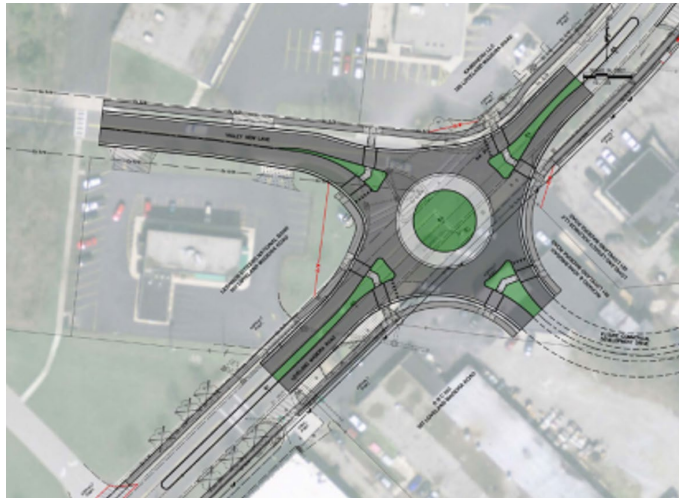

City Share: \$250,540

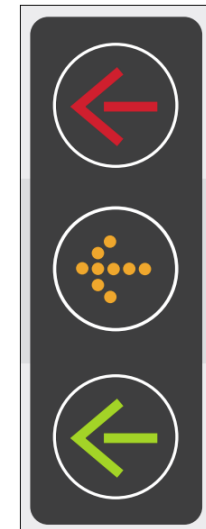


State Route 48 Sidewalk Design

Project advances SR 48 Sidewalk Project which will connect all of the city's Warren County residents to the Downtown District

Total Cost: \$260,924
Grant Funds: \$196,032
City Share: \$64,892

Ongoing Traffic Improvements – Turn Signal Modification – West Loveland Ave. and Lebanon Rd.



- West Loveland Avenue/Lebanon Road Intersection Daily Traffic = 77,487 Vehicles Per Day
- Project includes the Installation of a Flashing Yellow Arrow (FYA) on the Westbound Left Turn onto Lebanon Road
- FYA's reduce left Turn Crashes and Minimize Travel Delays
- **Total Project Cost: \$12,800**

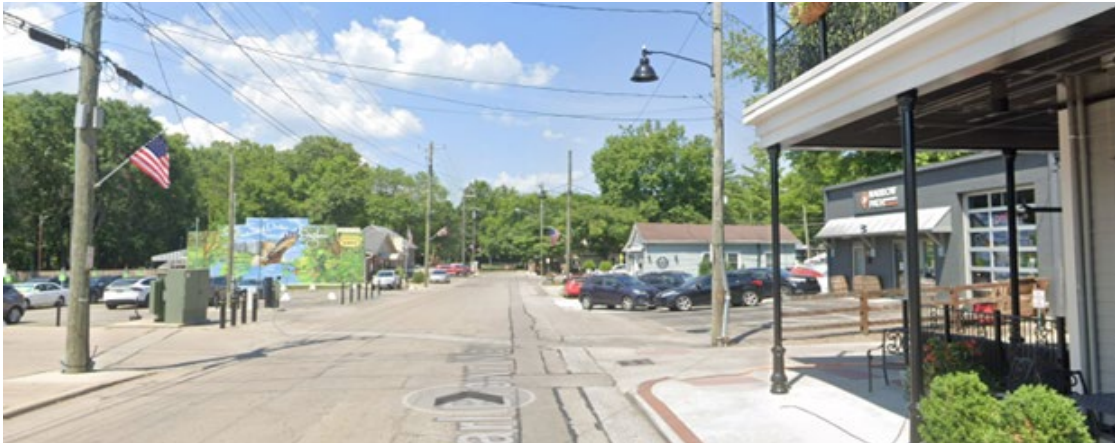

Project Implementation Components

- Proactive Analysis Across Entire Environment
 - 24/7 Remote Monitoring
 - Endpoint Backup
 - User Awareness Training
- Restricting Access with Suspicious Activity
 - Consistent Network Scanning and Assessment
 - Network Penetration Testing

Project Cost: \$95,000 split across City funds

Downtown Projects



North Karl Brown Way Streetscape

- Project Includes Downtown Streetscape Plan Sidewalks along east side of North Karl Brown
 - Project Cost: \$24,500
- **Funding Source: Downtown TIF**



Downtown Business Directory

- Directory will provide location, product and other information of downtown businesses
- To be located on West Loveland near Bike Trail Crossing
 - Project Cost: \$38,000
- **Funding Source: Downtown TIF**

Other 2026 CIP Projects: Commerce Park Entryway Improvements



- Reinvests in important City Business Center
- Utilizes Commerce Park Business to complete project – Grunder Landscaping
 - Project Cost: \$7,000

Project in Development Phase – Nisbet Park Playset Expansion (Grant Dependent)



Project Components and Elements

- Expansion of Playset Area
- Adds New Playground Equipment
- Mulch surface replaced with Synthetic Turf
- Increases age range of park equipment
