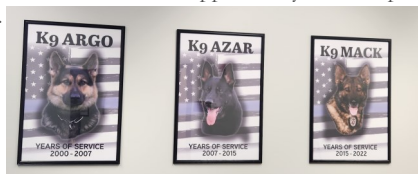
Administration

Chief Huber and Assistant City Manager Wright had the opportunity to meet with the Station 63 Design Team to wrap up several elements of the overall site design for the project. Discussions included stormwater controls, and mechanical, electrical, and plumbing information. Work continues to finalize the design.

Assistant to the City Manager, Misty Clark, held a 4th of July recap meeting this week with multiple city staff members. Given the tremendous amount of effort that Misty and her team put in to staging this event, it always beneficial to meet shortly afterwards to look at needed changes.

The West Loveland Avenue Bridge Congestion Mitigation Study Stakeholder kickoff meeting was held, and a very productive discussion occurred among various representatives of the City and adjoining communities. Results of the survey were also discussed, along with key concerns of the various stakeholders that will help inform the study process.

The Argo Conference Room at City Hall received design upgrades this week, with a tribute to the city's K9 program. The three retired K9's are now proudly displayed in the conference room. The design of the framed posters was completed in house by the city's Marketing and Communications Coordinator, Krista Rose. Krista's work was supported by Permit Specialist, Becky Noel and K9 Officer, Kyle Bibelhausen.



Building and Zoning

Staff held a meeting on Wednesday of this week with McBride Dale Clarion (MDC) to discuss progress on the overhaul of the Planning and Zoning Code. In addition, staff will be facilitating a meeting with representatives from MDC and Urban Canopy Works to ensure that the new code contains regulatory provisions that ensure street tree plantings for new developments, as well as redeveloping properties.

Wednesday, the Historic Preservation and Planning Commission (HPPC) met to review a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) for new signage at Teak Restaurant, which is opening in Loveland Station. The projecting style sign was approved by the HPPC.



Here are some additional highlights from the Building and Zoning Department's activities during the past week:

- Permits were issued for yet another new home in the Chimneyridge Subdivision, evidencing strong interest in this premier residential development in the City.
- The Department held an inspection of the hood suppression system at Teak, located in Loveland Station. They anticipate opening very soon. Also, this week, the Historic Preservation and Planning Commission met to approve the new "blade" style sign on the exterior of the structure, and the signage company is now working to meet the City's outdoor lighting requirements.
- A permit was also approved this week for site work at MacArthur Park Apartments.
- A permit application was received for a new forklift ramp at Marsh Building Products, and plans have been reviewed and approved with the permit ready to issue.

- Insulation and framing inspections took place in Blossom Hill, on units located at 125 and 127 Blossom View.

The Department continues to actively address property maintenance and zoning issues throughout the City on a location-specific basis. The Planning and Zoning Commission will hold a scheduled meeting on Tuesday, August 1, 2023, at 7:00 PM. The Commission will be discussing two separate proposed text amendments to the zoning code, in addition to conducting a combined Conditional Use and Site Plan review for the new restaurant facility located at 115 Railroad Avenue.

Public Works

Contractors with Bansal Construction and Trebor Electric braved soaring temperatures this week to relocate several underground electrical feeds at the Second Street (State Route 48) Turn Lane project, and to complete other electrical work prior to commencement of the construction of the new turning lane. Crews successfully completed pedestrian signal pole installations and also relocated the existing traffic signal mast pole along West Loveland Avenue with minimal disruption to vehicular traffic.

Work on the Loveland Miamiville Road Sidewalk project is fully underway. The first of many projects, the city will be completing to connect our neighborhoods to the downtown district and other city amenities. The city would like to thank the Loveland Presbyterian Church for allowing the project's crews to stage on their property, this is greatly appreciated by the contractor and the city.



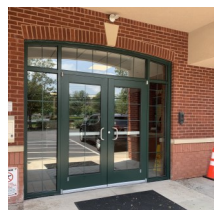

Park. With that, city staff members including, Mandy Lucas, Krista Rose, Misty Clark and Becky Noel met this week to review various options for the dog park. It was concluded that in addition to new park benches, an agility course would be a nice addition to the park. We anticipate the new additions to the park to be completed in late August.
