Building and Zoning

- The permits were issued for the renovations of the 5 buildings at MacArthur Park Apartments.
- An engineering change was received for the alterations of the Habitat Re-Store, 10681 Loveland Madeira.
- Multiple residential permits were reviewed and issued, as well as inspections on various ongoing residential projects throughout the city.

Public Works

This week, I was notified by our City Engineer, Cindy Klopfenstein, that she has accepted the same position with the Village of Indian Hill. Looking back at my 39 years of working in the public sector, it is hard for me to think of a more dedicated and conscientious employee than Cindy. Cindy's value to city has been much more than the millions of grant dollars she has secured for infrastructure improvements in the city; it's has been the caring and respectful way she treats city residents, fellow staff members and just about everyone she has ever met.

The second seating area is under construction at Nisbet park. The concrete base has been completed, and 2400 square feet of pavers have been installed. It is anticipated that the picnic tables will ship by the end of the month.

As part of our ongoing improvements to our park restroom facilities, a new epoxy/urethane flake floor was installed at the Lever park restrooms. This is the same application that was recently installed at the Nisbet park restroom facilities. This included



diamond grinding the existing aged concrete floors, making necessary repairs, and applying the new epoxy/urethane flake floor. This provides a fresh clean look that is easy to maintain.

This week LPD hosted the monthly meeting of the Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky Crime Stoppers. Crime Stoppers is comprised of diverse, active and dedicated community representatives.
