Administration

The Downtown Parking Lot project commenced on Monday with tree removal. With the trees removed, excavation of the site began on Thursday, which is anticipated to take approximately 15 days to complete.



The annual Hearts Afire event was held last weekend and it was a big hit. Seemed like there was always something going on, and those in attendance had a great time.

To make Hearts Afire possible, a lot goes on behind the scenes. City staff members, Misty Clark, Krista Rose and Becky Noel were supported by volunteers all who have been working on this event for months.

Brad Sigler, Chris Rose, and James Sowders from Public Works spent the week leading up to the event decorating the downtown. On the day of the event, 10 Loveland U graduates volunteered to help with the pageant and several volunteers from the Loveland Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association directed traffic at the bike trail. City staff who worked the event included: Ryan Singleton and Shaun Tringelof from Public Works, and Officers Vickie Johnson, Jacob Steinkoenig, Brandon Ashbury, and Jenna Fisher. Building and Zoning

The Board of Zoning Appeals met Thursday evening to continue its review of a proposed multi-family development in the Loveland Heights on Highland Avenue. Following a reduction in the project's number of units from 62 to 50, and a corresponding increase in parking spaces, the BZA granted the requested variances.



Other Building and Zoning updates:

- The retaining wall at 912 Loveland Madeira is nearing completion.
- The addition at the Children's Academy of Loveland is in the framing stages.
- The interior alterations at the Habitat Re-Store are nearing completion.
- CO was issued for 126 Blossom View.
- The 3 homes under construction in Chimney Ridge are progressing.
- Plans came in to move the existing awning at Trailside Provisions to in front of Better Blend and then a smaller awning will replace Trailside's. Plans are in review and the awnings will be going to HPPC the end of this month.

Finance

The Finance Department is starting to see an uptick in walk-in traffic for assistance with income taxes. Although City Hall is open until 4:30 PM, we ask tax costumers if they do plan to come to City Hall that they arrive before 4:00 PM to allow our staff plenty of time to serve them. Self service via the RITA website (ritaohio.com) is available 24/7.

On Monday and Tuesday afternoon next week, Finance Staff will be taking part in training for the new upgrade in utility billing software. The Finance window will still be open, but we ask for patience as there may be a wait as we train to serve you better.

Public Works

New signs were installed at both the Wall Street and Phillips Park entrances into the Simpson Nature Preserve last week.



The East Loveland Avenue Bridge Replacement project is fully underway. This multi-jurisdictional project which in addition to replacing an aged bridge, will also replace sanitary sewer and water mains along with adding new sidewalks and correcting storm drainage issues. We greatly appreciate the patience of the area neighbors and we will continue to communicate with the contractor any needed adjustment to reduce the inconvenience the project is causing.



Other important project updates:

- Plans for the second phase of the Loveland Miamiville Sidewalk project are completed and will be going out to bid on February 29. Getting an early jump on the design and bidding of this project will allow for construction to begin this spring. This is another step towards the city's goal of creating connectivity among its neighborhoods
- ODNR has notified the city that the mid and north sections of the new O'Bannon Creek bike trail bridge will be delivered on February 29.
