
Building and Zoning

Public Works

Spring Brush Pick-Up has been completed. Following this, our annual Spring Street Sweeping program kicked off on Tuesday, ensuring that our streets are clean and well-maintained for the community.

Public Works and LSFD worked jointly to conduct a hydrant flushing in the Brandywine Subdivision. In addition to removing any sediments in the water, the process also ensures that all the fire hydrants are working properly.



In a commendable achievement, Public Works Supervisor Jason Brock and Assistant Public Works Director Shawn Hartness were honored with associate certificates from the Urban Foresters of the Ohio Division of Forestry. This recognition signifies their completion of the Freshman and Sophomore years of the Tree Commission Academy, a program focusing on urban forestry and arboriculture. Our staff's dedication to professional development underscores our commitment to excellence in maintaining and enhancing the green spaces within our community.

Tuesday was the bid opening for the Loveland Miamiville Road Sidewalk Phase 2 of the three phase project, which will create a pedestrian connection to the Steeplechase subdivision. Council authorizing the engineering and design of this project in the fall of 2023 has allowed construction to begin this spring. Next year, the final phase of the project will be completed, connecting the Huntington subdivision.

Following years of coordination, Hamilton County began construction on the West Loveland Avenue Bridge Project this week. Although they will maintain pedestrian traffic on the bridge throughout the project, lane closures designed to protect the crews and assure ample space for equipment, is impacting traffic flow in and out of downtown. With three bridge projects and a new parking lot all underway at the same time, this is one of the most active construction periods in recent memory. There is some comfort in knowing that ODNR reports that the bike trail bridge project is on schedule to open to the public in May, and the contractor for the East Loveland Avenue Bridge project hopes to have at least one lane of traffic open in late April or early May.

At Tuesday's City Council meeting, current and former Loveland Police personnel joined council in saluting Lieutenant Mike Szpak who retired on March 13 following 28 years of service to the city. I had the privilege of working with Mike for the past 10 years and can say that he was always a true professional, and was very proud to represent the city.
