Administration

Final preparations were completed for paving of the city's new downtown parking lot next week. Next weeks paving will include creation of the center turn lane into the parking lot from State Route 48.



The Hill Wagoner Cemetery Preservation Committee met this week and elected officers. The committee members also took a tour of the cemetery at the conclusion of the meeting.

Loveland U held its annual Class Reunion last night at Rose Boutique and Wine Bar. Past graduates were encouraged to promote the program and help recruit new attendees. Fourteen applications have been received to date, leaving room for 16 more people. Applications will be accepted until the end of June. Building and Zoning

This week, Building and Zoning Department Intern, Ronan Mirza, completed a base map to be used for the city's Clermont County Sidewalk Study, which was a result of City Council's 2024/2025 Goals. The map indicates which street within the Clermont County portion of the city have or do not have sidewalks installed. Once watermain information is added to the map, it will determine where future sidewalks can be installed to improve connectivity from our Clermont County neighborhoods into the downtown district. Other activities this week included:

- The above ceiling inspections were conducted for Premiere Surgical Institute, located at 1303 Mattec Drive. This was for the fire alarm and fire suppression going in.
- The revisions came in for the alterations at 577 Loveland Madeira Road. They are in review.
- The permit is ready to issue for the addition at Children's Meeting House, 927 O'Bannonville Rd.
- Sign permits are ready for Ulmer's Auto Care, 301 Loveland Madeira and for Nostalgia Ink, 403 Loveland Madeira Rd.
- Re-roofing is underway at 916 Loveland Madeira Rd.

Public Works

City Engineer Kelsey Richards was appointed and accepted to be on the Ohio Stormwater Association Board. The OSWA Board consists of 15 members from the State of Ohio. The Ohio Stormwater Association is a group of public and private citizens dedicated to advancing stormwater management and related natural resources through education, leadership, watershed-based coordination, and technical assistance in Ohio.

On Wednesday Assistant City Manager Chris Wojnicz and City Engineer Kelsey Richards attended the 41st annual Traffic Engineering Workshop in Fairfield, Ohio. The workshop is designed for people involved in traffic and transportation activities in their communities. The workshop covered a wide range of topics including, The future of rail passenger service in Ohio, road diets, bridge replacement projects, and grant funding.



Sidewalks along the northside of the West Loveland Avenue / Paxton Bridge were completed this week. Next week, railing along the top of the parapet wall will be installed on the north side of the bridge. On June 17, the project will switch to the south side of the bridge and corresponding traffic adjustments will be completed.

This week LPD and LSFD partnered to sponsor a Public Safety Cookout at the Care Center.
