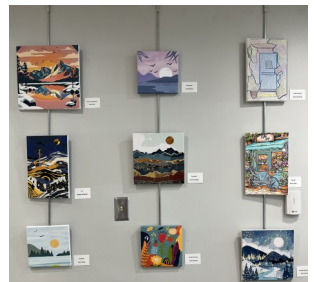
Officer Jesse Moore recognized by City Council for 10 Years of Service

Administration

At Tuesday's City Council meeting, Whistle Stop Clay Works was recognized for their 15 year anniversary. Since opening in 2010 Whistle Stop Clay Works has not only provided a place to create pottery but has become a creative hub for artists, students, and visitors of all ages. It is a space where people can connect, learn, and express themselves, and it reflects the heart and soul of Loveland's vibrant arts community.

On Thursday, Marketing and Communications Coordinator, Stephanie Watson, Zoning and Economic Development Specialist, Eva Wisby, and Utility Billing Clerk, Mandy Lucas attended the Symmetry Women's Luncheon hosted by the Little Miami River Chamber Alliance. The luncheon allows for dynamic women in the community to come together and exchange insights and strategies for navigating career and personal life, while also engaging with our local business owners.

Building and Zoning

- Plans were received for interior alterations of 600 W. Loveland Ave, Suite 10, where Cocoa Lounge will set up shop. Some additional information is needed before the permit can be issued.
- The insulation inspection was completed at 210 Carrington this week.
- The new sign is in place and passed inspection for Heavenly Nails Spa, 683 Loveland Madeira Rd.
- The slab/monolithic pour was completed for the new storage sheds at the HS, 1 Tiger TL.
- The new covered deck at The Wicked Pickle, 123 Railroad, has been completed and passed its final inspection. The new space will allow for more customers as well as provide cover for diners to enjoy the space no matter the weather.
- The Lodge, 12050 Montgomery Rd, continues their alterations on the water damaged portion of the building, with insulation inspections taking place this week.
- The permit was issued to the Fraternal Order of Eagles, 127 N. Karl Brown Way, to replace their windows

Public Works



Our commitment to maintaining a vibrant and welcoming downtown area continues. This week, our Public Works staff began revitalizing the landscape between Railroad Avenue and the bike trail. This project will include the installation of trees, flowering plants, large decorative stone, and mulch to enhance the overall appearance of the area. These upgrades are part of our broader effort to create an attractive and enjoyable environment for all who live, work, and visit the downtown area.

This week, the Cherokee Drive Water Main Project reached several key milestones. On Thursday, a final road closure was implemented to complete the last connection to the new water main. Only

three catch basins remain to be installed, at which point the stormwater portion of the project will be complete. The contractor is scheduled to pour the remaining curb and sidewalk sections early next week. In addition, approximately 80% of the project area has been seeded and strawed. Final paving is expected to take place in two weeks, keeping the project on track for completion.

Public Safety

This week Detective Jesse Moore celebrated his 10-year anniversary with the Loveland PD. A graduate of Florida State University, Detective Moore has served with distinction in a variety of roles—from being Loveland’s first School Resource Officer at the high school, to his current position as detective the Loveland Police Department. Over the years, he has earned multiple certifications, including Less Lethal Instructor, Crime Prevention Specialist, and Field Training Officer. This fall, Detective Moore will step into a new role as the Department’s Community Resource Officer. Thank you, Detective Moore, for your continued dedication and service to the Loveland community.
