City Council names the new Fire Station the Chief Otto J. Huber Fire Station 63

With a full house gathered to celebrate Chief Huber's recent recognition as the 2025 recipient of the Alan Brunacini Fire Service Executive Safety Award, Mayor Bailey issued a proclamation in his honor during Tuesday's City Council meeting. In a surprise move, City Council then amended the agenda to add a resolution formally naming the new fire station the **Chief Otto J. Huber Fire Station 63**. On behalf of Mayor Bailey, City Council, and all staff members who have the privilege of working alongside Chief Huber, it is a true honor to recognize his unwavering commitment to public safety and his passion for making LSFD one of the nation's finest fire departments. - An earthwork permit was issued to 270 E. Kemper Rd, where they are filling the lot to accommodate a future building.
- The permit was issued for the sprinkler system for the new fire station, 220 E. Loveland.
- Ulmer's will be re-roofing their facility at 301 Loveland Madeira Rd. The permit was issued this week.
- Inspections are ongoing at Chimney Ridge, with another new home being permitted this week.
- Plans came in for site plan review for 9390 Union Cemetery Rd. Once staff reviews are complete, the applicant will be placed on the agenda to go to the Planning & Zoning Commission.


Public Works

Public Works had a busy week keeping our community running smoothly. Crews have been out repairing catch basins and completing water meter readings to ensure reliable service for residents. On Tuesday, staff replaced a fire hydrant on Cardinal Court, and on Wednesday night, they responded quickly to repair a water main break on Valley View Lane, restoring service as soon as possible.
