Administration

On Sunday, City Hall was standing room only as the community came together to honor Peggy Goodwin, who passed away in November. Whenever the city or any organization needed help, Peggy always said yes. As the City's 2022 Citizen of the Year, Peggy leaves behind a lasting mark on this community and on the countless residents she inspired to volunteer. Building and Zoning

This weeks Building and Zoning permit activity:

- Scrip-Safe, 136 Commerce, is replacing their furnace.
- The new band tower is up and ready to go at Loveland High School, 1 Tiger Trail. They passed their final inspection this week.
- Work continues to progress on the new fire station, 220 E. Loveland. They passed another footer inspection this week as well as submitted an engineering change to their fire suppression plans.

Public Works

Our Public Works staff collected and chipped a total of 206 Christmas trees as part of this year's Christmas tree recycling effort.

On Sunday, staff treated city roadways to address snow and icy conditions, helping ensure safe travel for residents. The department is actively preparing for the winter storm forecasted for this weekend.

In addition to winter weather operations, Public Works crews repaired water main breaks on Quailwoods Drive and Symbola Drive, restoring service efficiently while minimizing disruption to residents.

Finance

The Finance Commission met on Tuesday which included the oath of office being administered to John Hart, Mike Veroni and Rob Weisgerber. The commission reviewed the 4th quarter Financial Results and the final 2025 Income Tax numbers as presented by Director of Finance, Mark Medlar.
