Administration

On Monday, Assistant City Manager Chris Wojnicz and I met with Drew Todd and Ziah Huett from the Center for Local Government (CLG). The city is a member of CLG, which provides resources to local governments, including professional training opportunities and participation in a health benefits consortium. During the meeting, Chris emphasized the importance of local governments working together to advocate for increased funding options to address PFAS remediation.

Building and Zoning

This weeks update from the Building and Zoning Department

- Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, 101 S. Lebanon Road, will be replacing their HVAC units. Plans are in review.
- Plans came in for the emergency replacement of the fire alarm panel at LCNB, 500 Loveland Madeira Road.
- Work is back in progress on the remaining two homes under construction on W. Loveland Avenue. With 619 W. Loveland Avenue now being sold, finishing touches are being made and inspections are resuming.
- The plans passed review and the permit is now issued so construction can begin on the retaining wall at St. Columban, 894 W. Loveland Avenue.
- With the snow melting and warmer temperatures on the horizon, residents are beginning to plan their spring projects. Fence, shed, and addition permit applications and plans are rolling in.

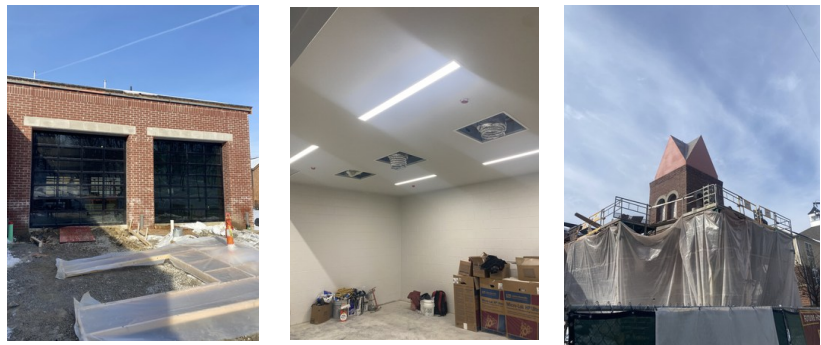
